Mineral Legislation and Policy on Export and Import of Minerals/Ores

1. MINERAL LEGISLATION

A. Amendments/ Notifications:

1. F.No.4(2)/97-M-I – In continuation of Mines Ministry's Resolution of even number dated the 13th March, 2009 reconstituting the Central Geological Programming Board (CGPB) and its Committees, it has been decided to include the following in the Board and its Committees :-

- (i) Joint Secretary and Financial Advisor, Ministry of Mines as a Member of the Central Geological Programming Board;
- (ii) DGM, Govt. of Chhattisgarh as a Member of Committee No. III; and
- (iii) DGM, Govt. of Jharkhand as a Member of Committee No. X.

2. S.O. 1545(E).- Whereas, Mount Abu area has significant ecological importance comprising of tropical dry deciduous forests at lower altitude and evergreen forests at higher altitude and the flora and fauna of the region comprising several endemic and rare species; besides Mount Abu has natural heritage such as Nakki Lake and man-made heritage like Dilwara temples and other heritage buildings and structures.

And, whereas, considerable adverse environment impact has been caused due to degradation of the environment with excessive soil erosion and water and air pollution on account of certain developmental activities, thereby endangering not only the natural resources, but also affecting the health and very survival of living beings.

The following activities are to be regulated in the Eco-sensitive Zone, namely:-

Quarrying and Mining:

- (i) The Quarrying and Mining activities shall be restricted in the Eco-sensitive Zone.
- (ii) The Monitoring Committee shall have the authority to grant special permission for limited quarrying of materials required for the construction of local residential housing and traditional road making and maintenance work in Mount Abu, based on site evaluation.

- (iii) No quarrying shall be permitted on steep hill slopes with a gradient of 20 degrees or more or areas with a high degree of erosion, or on forestland.

2. FUNCTIONS

- (i) To detail out the role and function of IBM in the light of the National Mineral Policy and the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act and Rules framed thereunder.
- (ii) To make recommendations on the strengthening required in making IBM an effective regulator promoting scientific mining with particular reference to Mining Plans, Mine Closure Plans and Sustainable Development framework.
- (iii) To lay down the framework of a comprehensive and transparent mines and minerals information system enabling progression into the Mining Tenement and Registry by IBM.

B. : Court Decisions :

**1. Nain Singh, Petitioner v. State of Madhya Pradesh & others, Respondents,
AIR 2009, Madhya Pradesh 97, Vol.96, Part 1145, May 2009.**

Subject :

Challenging constitutional validity of the amendment made in Rule 38(4) of the M.P. Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1996.

Facts :

The Society headed by the petitioner is a Co-operative Society. The members of which are belonging to Scheduled Tribe and in view of preferential rights they were entitled to and were in fact granted the quarry permit. According to them, vide Gazette Notification No.F-19-10-99-XII-2 published on 30.5.2001, original Chapter – VI has been amended and instead of grant of quarry permit on basis of preferential rights, the quarries are required to be auctioned. The validity of petitioner permit was up to 23.3.2002 but before the expiry of the period vide order dated 6.2.2002, the quarry permit was cancelled. The petitioner submitted that this action on the part of the respondent is bad, firstly because the petitioners were not allowed to exploit the permit till the date of expiry and because the provisions of Rules 36 to 40 as amended, are ultra vires of the Constitution.

Decision :

The High Court has referred to the Rule 38 (4) of the Madhya Pradesh Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1996, and stated that a quarry permit was required to be granted only to the residents of the Panchayat where the quarry is located in a particular order of preference. Undisputedly, the preference were fixed by the State Government and the petitioners became beneficiary under the said policy/rules. The State Government has made certain amendments in the M.P. Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1996. The action of the Government in changing the preferences was to earn more revenue in favour of Gram Panchayats, Janpad Panchayats and Zilla Panchayats who in their turn are required to provide facilities and amenities to the local residents. The High Court further stated that, if the Government felt that the quarry should be auctioned so that the Panchayats which are engaged in the public welfare etc. are benefited then no wrong in the policy (made for preferences or priorities) should be found. The benefit of such policy should always flow in favour of the large number of people in comparison to a small body which is a part of the society.

In conclusion, High Court has held that the policy is valid and the amendment in the Chapter – VI of the above said rules, which relate to “Grant of Trade Quarries”, is not ultra vires of the Constitution or offend the spirit of the Constitution. The High Court has dismissed the petition.

Petition dismissed.

2. Novel Granites Ltd. & others, Petitioners v. Government of Andhra Pradesh & others, Respondents AIR 2009, Andhra Pradesh 107, Vol. 96, Part 1145, May 2009.

Subject :

Challenging the delegating power of the State Government for expanding scope of definition of mineral.

Facts :

The petitioners, most of whom are industrial units involved in the processing and pulverizing of mineral and some of them who are lessees to extract mineral such as granite, dolomite, white shale, limestone, steatite have mainly felt aggrieved by the definition of 'Mineral' contained in Rule 2(1) (h) of the Andhra Pradesh Mineral Dealers Rules, 2000 (for short, 'the Rules') as amended by G.O. Ms.No.330 dated 14.6.2001.

The case of the petitioners is that the definition of 'Mineral' which enlarged the scope of mineral as defined in Section 3(a) of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (for short, 'the Act') is far beyond the delegated power of respondent No.1. The petitioners averred that by enlarging the scope of the definition of mineral, the respondents have brought the processed minerals and the finished products within their regulatory control, which resulted in violation of their fundamental rights guaranteed under Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution of India.

The amendments, to curb illegal mining have been introduced w.e.f. 20.11.1999 in Section 23-C of the Act. The said provision empowered the State Governments to make Rules for preventing illegal mining, transportation and storage of minerals. In exercise of its rule making power, the Government of Andhra Pradesh framed the Rules, which came into force w.e.f. 01.04.2001. The main features of these Rules include bar on persons other than lease holder or a holder of Dealers Registration to stock, sell or offer for sale any minerals in any place except under Dealers Registration issued by the competent authority, to transport, carry by any means or cause to transport or carry any minerals from the places of raising or sell at any place without a valid permit, if these Rules are contravened, the mineral shall be liable to be seized along with whole equipment, vehicles etc., either at the mine head or in transit or point of storage or at the place of consumption. The main aim and objective of these Rules was to curb the illicit mining, transportation of minerals and to prevent the leakage of the mineral revenue to the State Exchequer and they have facilitated the dealers and processors to procure and trade minerals with the legal documents apart from getting free transit passes on production of valid proof of payment of royalty/seigniorage fee of raw/processed mineral.

The Learned Counsel for the petitioners contended that the State Government, being a delegate, cannot add to, amend or vary in any manner, the definition of 'Mineral' contained in Section 3(a) of the Act. The expanded definition of the 'Mineral' under the Rules resulted in bringing the processed mineral under the State's regulatory control for the first time which is far beyond the delegated powers of the State Government.

The Learned Special Government Pleader, contended that the State Government has not expanded the scope of the definition of 'Mineral', but it has merely made explicit what is implicit in the definition of 'Mineral' in section 3(a) of the Act. He further contended that either the Rules in general or the definition of mineral in particular do not, in any

manner, affect the interests of the petitioners, because they were intended only to check the illicit mining, which escaped the revenue to the Government and that they do not impose any additional obligations on the petitioners except obtaining necessary licenses and getting registered as Dealers.

Decision :

The High Court has referred to the definition of 'Mineral' in Rule 2(h) of the Rules and stated that State Government far too expanded the scope of the definition of mineral by including in its definition processed mineral and final product emerging out of such process. While it is very much doubtful whether even the parliament would have made any such rule without amending the definition of mineral in Section 3 (a). The High Court has further stated that the State Government is not competent to stretch the definition of 'Mineral' to the extreme extent of subjecting the processed and finished product derived from the mineral to the regulatory control by including the same in the definition of 'Mineral'. The object of delegating rule making power under Section 23-C being confined to arrest of illicit mining, transport and storage, there is no necessity to stretch the regulatory arm beyond these stages and interfere with processing and manufacturing activities. In fact, to prevent illegal mining, there is no need to make rules covering such activities, because no lease can operate quarry and extract mineral clandestinely, without the knowledge of the departmental officials. Similarly, the mineral extracted cannot be transported and stored without the lessee or the purchaser obtaining necessary permits. If there is effective check and control at these three stages, there is no necessary what so ever for the State Government or its officers to exercise control over the processed or finished product to find out whether royalty and dead rent were paid in respect of the mineral before it is processed.

The High Court has also stated that there is nothing in definition of 'Mineral' contained in the Act from which it can be inferred that the processed and finished product derived from mineral also falls in the said definition. There is nothing implicit in the said definition in the Act, to justify the State Government to broaden the scope of the definition of 'Mineral' in purported exercise of its rule making power. A delegate can not add to, amend or vary the definition contained in the parent Act.

In conclusion, the High Court has held that the explanation to Rule 2 (h) by which the processed mineral and final products are treated as 'Mineral' is ultra vires the rule making power of the State Government and the same is accordingly struck down. The definition of 'Dealer' in Rule 2 (1) (d) shall be read down as to exclude the persons, who undertake manufacturing/ processing activity using mineral as raw material. The State Government and its officials authorized for this purpose shall be free to inspect and check any premises or factory/ industry where the mineral is stored before it is processed/ manufactured and exercise the power of seizure of mineral before it is processed and converted into a finished product, if it is found that such mineral has not suffered royalty and/ or dead rent. Accordingly, the High Court has partly allowed the writ petition.

Petition partly allowed.

**3. Sanjay Pathak, Petitioner v. State of Jharkhand & others, Respondents,
AIR 2009, Jharkhand 79, Vol.96, Part 1147, July 2009.**

Subject :

Challenging the mining operations in area for seriously affecting life and health of the villagers.

Facts :

Lease was granted to the respondent No.6 of plot No.310, area 1.55 acres in village Asnanulia, P.O. Pander, P.S. Bishrampur for conducting mining operations. The petitioner has contended that the mining operations in the aforesaid area is seriously affecting the life and health of the villagers, which constitute a cluster of not less than 100 houses with a population of approximately 1000 along with their cattle and an anganbari school along with the temples where the villagers come to worship are also existing. It was submitted that the leaseholder right for conducting mining operations had been cancelled by the Deputy Commissioner also and overruling the same the Commissioner granted mining rights to the respondent No.6.

Decision :

The High Court has ordered that a factual report be submitted by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Daltonganj after conducting a site inspection of the aforesaid area. This writ petition be listed for further hearing on 18th November, 2008 and the report be submitted by the next date. The High Court has further ordered that in the meantime, interim order of stay granted earlier shall remain effective.

Order accordingly.

**4. Naresh Verma, Petitioner v. State of Rajasthan & others, Respondents,
AIR 2009, Rajasthan 144, Vol.96, Part 1149, September, 2009.**

Subject :

Challenging the refusal of NOC and revoking the allotment order for mining lease.

Facts :

An application was filed by the petitioner for grant of mining lease under the Rajasthan Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1986 (for short 'the Rules') for limestone on 11.11.1991 for the land situated in village Latoti, Tehsil Jaitaran, District Pali, measuring 300 x 300 sq. meters. On application, certain formalities were asked to be completed by the respondent Department. Thereafter, allotment order under Rule 8 of the Rules was issued in favour of the petitioner on 7.8.1992. In the said order, certain conditions were also incorporated for depositing advance royalty, National Saving Certificate of Rs.22,500/-, advance lease of Rs.22,500/- for three months and stamp papers of Rs.24,655/- and the petitioner soon after receiving the allotment order deposited all the aforesaid required documents and amount. Thereafter, the Assistant Mining Engineer wrote a letter to the District Collector, Pali for issuance of No Objection Certificate but as per petitioner no such condition was made in the allotment order for obtaining NOC from the District Collector and the lease deed was to be executed within a period of three months. The District Collector upon communication sent by Assistant Mining Engineer, Sojat City on 3.11.1992 forwarded the matter to the concerned Tehsildar and the concerned Tehsildar sent the same to the

Halka Patwari of village Latoti for ascertaining correct position of the land. The report submitted by Patwari was that impugned mine is three kilometer away from the Abadi area and there was no adverse effect, if the impugned lease is allotted to the petitioner. However, there was some encroachment over the impugned land in 2.6 bighas. The said report submitted by Patwari was submitted before the District Collector through Tehsildar.

The contention of petitioner is that Assistant Mining Engineer is not executing the lease-deed on the ground that the District Collector has not issued NOC. The Director, Mines and Geological Department, Government of Rajasthan, Udaipur has also revoked the allotment order passed in favour of the petitioner vide order dated 12.11.1993. Further, the contention of the petitioner is that there is no provision under the Rules with regard to obtaining NOC from the concerned District Collector.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner was not provided any opportunity of hearing before revoking the order passed by the respondents. There is no such provision in existence in the rules for obtaining the NOC from Collector. Further, he contended that after issuance of the allotment order under Rule 8 of the Rules, the Director has no jurisdiction to cancel the allotment order unless the conditions of allotment order are not fulfilled. It is also prayed that the order impugned dated 12.11.1993 for revoking the allotment order by the respondents so also the order passed in revision/ appeal dated 15.4.1996 may kindly be quashed and the respondents may be directed to execute the lease in favour of the petitioner. It is also contended that as per notification issued by the Government on 7.2.1998, there is no requirement for obtaining any NOC from the District Collector but the respondents have illegally acted upon and denied the allotment of mining lease to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the respondents contended that the requirement of NOC is necessary because the District Collector is only authority for the Revenue Department to ascertain whether the land in question can be allotted for the purpose of mining or can give report with regard to status of the land. It is further contended that there is a public way over the proposed land, therefore, the District Collector, Pali refused to grant NOC therefore, the authority of the District Collector or requirement for taking NOC from the District Collector cannot be questioned by the petitioner.

Decision :

The High Court has stated that for area of mining lease, there is provision under the Rules which is Rule 11. Rule 11 of the Rules speaks that mining lease shall be granted for such area as the Government may deem fit, when the State Government has jurisdiction to grant mining lease as it deems fit then the authority of the District Collector, Pali cannot be questioned because the District Collector is administrative head of the District in the Revenue Department and before issuing mining lease as per Rule 11 of the Rules, the Mining Department is under obligation to ascertain the status of the land. Therefore, the authority of the District Collector and the question of obtaining NOC from the District Collector cannot be questioned. The order impugned passed by the Mining Department is in consonance with the provisions of law and does not require any interference by this court. The High Court further stated that it is nowhere provided by the Government that NOC from the District Collector is not mandatory.

Lastly, the High Court has dismissed the writ petition.

Petition dismissed.

5. Pawanjay Steel & Power Ltd., Lohardaga, Petitioner v. State of Jharkhand & others, Respondents, AIR 2009, Jharkhand 105, Vol.96, Part 1149, September, 2009.

Subject :

Challenging the grant of mining lease of iron ore on the basis of Industrial Policy of the State Government.

Facts :

The petitioner-company engaged in the business of manufacturing sponge iron, had applied to the Respondents – State Government of Jharkhand for grant of mining lease for the specified area of land, way back on 8.1.2003 along with the prescribed fees and other requirements. Besides the petitioner - company, three other applicants, including the Respondents No.7, had also applied for grant of mining lease for the same area comprising of 922.30 acres of mining area identified by the State Government. Out of the total four applicants, two had withdrawn, leaving the petitioner and the Respondent No.7 only in the fray.

In response to the applications, the Respondent No.3, namely, the Director, Department of Mines & Geology, Mines Directorate, Ranchi invited the petitioner and the other applicants for granting hear to them under the provisions of Rule 26 of the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960 fixing 12.3.2004 as the date for hearing. Though the hearing was conducted but no further action was taken by the Respondent No.3. In the meantime, the petitioner – company entered into a memorandum of understanding on 1.6.2004 for establishing an iron ore manufacturing industry in the state of Jharkhand. The petitioner's grievance is that though at the time of hearing, the Respondent No.3 had assured the petitioner – company of granting mining lease of 50 percent of the applied area but ultimately the entire area was sanctioned to the Respondent No.7 without giving the petitioner any further opportunity of being heard or for negotiation.

The petitioner's further grievance is that vide letter No.2531 dated 8.12.2005, Respondent No.4, namely, the Deputy Secretary to the Government, Department of Mines & Geology, Jharkhand, Ranchi had forwarded a misleading comparative chart containing particulars of the petitioner's application and that of the Respondent No.7 to the Respondent No. 6, namely, the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Mines, New Delhi along with the State Government's recommendation approving the grant of mining lease to the Respondent No.7.

The petitioner filed a representation on 27.7.2005 before the Respondent No.4 followed by another representation on 20.12.2005 to the Respondent No.5, namely, the Secretary, Ministry of Mines, New Delhi. On receipt of the representation, the Respondent No.6 forwarded the same to the Respondent No.2, namely, the Secretary, Department of Mines and Geology, Jharkhand, Ranchi along with a covering letter asking the Respondent No. 2 to send his reply to two queries, namely the date of the application of each of the applicant over the area and to clarify as to whether the Respondent No.7 is the first applicant or a later applicant and also to submit his comments on the representation of the petitioner.

The petitioner also filed a fresh representation dated 28.2.2006, praying for recommending the petitioner's name to the Central Government for approval and also praying for allotment of the above iron ore mine to the petitioner – company. However, the Central Government vide letter No.5/40/2004-MIV dated 24.8.2006, under the signature of

Respondent No.6, conveyed to the State Government its approval for the grant of mining lease of the same area comprising of 922.30 acres, in favour of the Respondent No.7.

The petitioner filed a fresh representation before Respondent No.3 for reconsideration of the matter pointing out that on proper and rational comparison, the petitioner certainly stands superior in all respects to the Respondent No.7 and that petitioner – company was eligible in all respects for the grant of mining lease.

Learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner contended that the impugned approval of the Central Government dated 24.8.2006 is founded upon the recommendation of the State Government dated 29.6.2004 is wholly without due application of mind and based entirely on misrepresentations made by the State Government and also without considering the superior merit of the petitioner's eligibility vis-à-vis the Respondent No.7 in proper perspective. He has further contended that the State Government has with malafide intentions, ignored certain vital facts particularly that the State Government had itself entered into a memorandum of understanding with the petitioner – company for establishing an iron and steel manufacturing plant in the State of Jharkhand and also the fact that the petitioner – company has substantial experience in the business of manufacturing sponge iron at its established plant at Rourkela (Orissa) and has its associated ancilliary industries, some of them having long been established in the State of Jharkhand itself. Learned counsel relies upon a judgement of the Supreme Court in the case of Indian Metals & Ferro Alloys Ltd. v. Union of India & others (AIR 1991 SC 818).

Counter affidavit has been filed on behalf of the Respondent – State and stated that all the applicants were given opportunity of hearing before the Secretary of Mines in terms of Rule 26(1) of the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960 on different dates. The State Government after hearing the applicants and after recording its satisfaction, had recommended for grant of mining lease in favour of the Respondent No.7 and had forwarded its letter dated 29.6.2004 to the concerned Department of the Central Government for its approval for grant of the mining lease for iron ore and manganese ore to the Respondent No.7 under the provisions of Section 5(1) and Section 11(5) of the MMDR Act, 1957. While recommending the case of the Respondent No.7 the State Government has taken into consideration the fact that the Respondent No.7 is financially strong and a leading industry in the State of Jharkhand with an annual turnover of Rs.110 crores and has already established a sponge iron plant of a capacity of 300 tones per day.

The Learned Advocate General has contended that the petition was granted adequate opportunity of being heard in the matter of its claim and on comparative assessment and considering the industrial policy of the State Government, the Respondent No.7 was found to be preferable as compared to the petitioner. Furthermore, the Respondent No. 7 was the first applicant and in terms of provisions of Section 11(2) of the MMDR Act, 1957, the Respondent No.7 did have the right to claim preference and a comparative chart was prepared on the basis of the criteria as laid down under the provisions of Section 11(3) of the MMDR Act.

Learned Counsel for the respondents contended that though the petitioner company in the memorandum of understanding with the State Government had offered for setting its plant in the State of Jharkhand but the memorandum of understanding was valid for a period of one year only and it has lost its force thereafter and the petitioner company cannot therefore base its claim on the memorandum of understanding.

Decision :

The High Court has stated that the State Government made a comparative study of both the applicants in terms of the criteria laid down under the provisions of Section 11(3) of the MMDR Act and the corresponding Rules. Further, according to the State Government's Industrial Policy, the Respondent No.7 by virtue of its having already established a sponge iron manufacturing industry in the State of Jharkhand, has a superior merit over the petitioner, the State Government had decided to grant the mining lease to the Respondent No.7. The State Government has preferred to obtain the prior approval of the Central Government on its recommendation in favour of the Respondent No.7 and had forwarded its recommendation by its impugned letter dated 24.8.2006. Thus, the Central Government had accorded its approval to the State Government's recommendation in favour of the Respondent No.7. The High Court has further stated that the Industrial Policy of the State Government lays down the manner in which the State decides to promote industrial development in the best interests of the State and its people.

The High Court also stated that each of the applicants were given opportunity of hearing as per the provisions of Rule 26 of the MCR, 1960. The details of the information furnished by the individual applicants were duly considered and statement of comparative merit was prepared and the reasons assigned for preferring to grant the mining lease to the Respondent No.7. The Court do find any procedural irregularity or illegality or any act of arbitrariness or irrationality on the part of the State Government in recommending for the grant of mining lease in favour of the Respondent No. 7, under such circumstances, the decision of the State Government on the basis of its discretion does not call for any interference by this Court.

Thus, the High Court has dismissed the writ application for want of merit.

Application dismissed.

SECTION - 2

Trend in Mining, Prospecting and Reconnaissance

2.1 TREND IN MINING

A. Mining Lease Granted

During the period under review, the information pertaining to the grant of 249 leases covering an area of about 6,295 hectares was reviewed. Of these, Quartz accounted for 22 leases, followed by Limestone (17), China clay (12), Manganese ore (11), Dolomite (10), Red ochre (7), Iron ore & Silica sand (6 each), Fire clay, Gypsum, Laterite, White clay (4 each), Quartzite (3), Barytes (2) and Calcite, Feldspar, Mineral sand, Semi precious stone, Serpentine, Soapstone, Vermiculite (1 each). In addition to these, 130 mining leases granted were in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise limestone accounted for about 1,668 hectares, followed by Gypsum (1,391 hectares), Iron ore (864 hectares), Manganese ore (363 hectares), Dolomite (352 hectares), Mineral sand (180 hectares), Silica sand (164 hectares), Quartz (163 hectares), Laterite (73 hectares), China clay (53 hectares), White clay (48 hectares), Quartzite (38 hectares), Red ochre (32 hectares), Fire clay (15 hectares), Barytes (10 hectares), Calcite (5 hectares), Soapstone, Feldspar, Vermiculite, Serpentine each (4 hectares) and Semi precious stone (1 hectare). Mining leases granted in respect of two or more minerals covered an area of 857 hectares.

Reviewing statewise, number of mining leases and area granted in Rajasthan were 98 with 1,806 hectares followed by Andhra Pradesh 48 with 2,726 hectares, Tamil Nadu 32 with 66 hectares, Gujarat 28 with 161 hectares, Madhya Pradesh 22 with 429 hectares, Chhattisgarh 8 with 469 hectares, Karnataka 6 with 411 hectares, Kerala 5 with 190 hectares, Maharashtra 1 with 33 hectares and Uttarakhand 1 with 4 hectares.

The mineralwise number of mining leases granted together with lease area and details of mining leases granted are given in Tables 1A & 1B, respectively.

B. Mining Leases Executed

During the period under review, the information pertaining to the execution of 77 leases covering an area of about 591 hectares was reviewed. Of these, China clay accounted for 4 hectares followed by Red ochre 2, Gypsum, Laterite & Mineral sand (one each). In addition to these, 68 mining leases executed were in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise Gypsum accounted for about 98 hectares, followed by China clay 16 hectares, Red ochre 9 hectares, Laterite 8 hectares and Mineral sand 5 hectares. Mining leases executed in respect of two or more minerals covered 455 hectares.

Reviewing Statewise, number of mining leases and area executed in Rajasthan were 70 with 508.291 hectares followed by Karnataka 3 with 20.10 hectares, Andhra Pradesh 2 with 55.40 hectares and Kerala 2 with 7.70 hectares.

The mineralwise number of mining leases executed together with lease area and details of mining leases executed are given in Tables 2A & 2B, respectively.

C. Mining Leases Renewed

During the period under review, information pertaining to renewal of 18 mining leases covering an area of about 2837 hectares was received. Of these, Gypsum, Iron ore & Limestone (3 each) followed by Barytes, Ball clay, Mica one (each). In addition, 6 mining leases were renewed in respect of two or more minerals in association.

Reviewing areawise, Gypsum accounted for about 1981 hectares followed by Barytes 302 hectares, Iron ore 182 hectares, Limestone 171 hectares, Ball clay 34 hectares, Mica 33 hectares. Mining Leases renewed in respect of two or more minerals in association covered 134 hectares.

Reviewing statewide, number of mining leases and area renewed, Andhra Pradesh with 10 leases covering about 613 hectares followed by Rajasthan with 5 covering 2045 hectares, Karnataka 2 with 165 hectares, and Orissa 1 with 14 hectares.

Panna Diamond mines reopened after four years.
